

1. McCleary Museum & Heritage Center

426 S 3rd St, McCleary 360-470-2340

McCleary was built by one man, Henry McCleary, around his logging company and door factory. He owned sawmills, the door factory, logging operations, even the homes and heat that kept them warm. The museum documents this history and so much more.

This quaint church turned historical site highlights logging and homesteading history of the East Grays Harbor region. Enjoy a floor-to-ceiling collection of photos of logging camps and artifacts of the day, including logging tools, beautifully sewn fashions, and so much more.

6. Polson Museum

Experience the newly-restored 1924 Colonial Revival mansion of timber heirs Arnold and Priscilla Polson. Exhibits exploring Grays Harbor's Native American, settlement, and industrial history are featured throughout. Highlights include a model logging railroad, original dollhouse and much more. The grounds include a rose garden and Railroad Camp, and housing tools of the trade including the 1906 Polson 45 Baldwin locomotive.

7. International Mermaid Museum

This site is dedicated to teaching ocean ecology from seashore to sea floor immersed in mermaid mythology uniting world oceanic cultures. The museum has a unique gift shop with a wine and spirit tasting bar, plus a sluice box for visitors to mine gems, seashells and fossils.

8. Grays Harbor Lighthouse

Take the 135-step adventure up Washington's tallest lighthouse! At 107 feet tall, the Grays Harbor Lighthouse offers one of the Harbor's greatest views. The Grays Harbor Lighthouse is on the National Register of Historic Places.

Housed in the original Coast Guard Station, the Westport Maritime Museum showcases all aspects of maritime heritage. A first order, Fresnel lens from the Destruction Island Lighthouse is displayed in a world-class exhibit that allows visitors to get a close up view.

The site is not only the State's oldest public Aquarium, it is one of the few remaining family run Aquariums on the West Coast! Since 1955, the aquarium has received its multitude of fish on display from local charters and commercial fishermen, offering a look at the local fishing industry as well as sea life.

13. Quinault Tribal Museum

Exhibits at the Quinault Tribal Museum include a large display of artifacts, stone tools, basketry, carvings, and other items of interest along with family collections. The Tribal Library has a small collection of library books and stories told by the Quinault people. Within the archive are historical documents, ethnographic field notes, photos, and the Bicentennial Project.

14. Lake Quinault Museum

Set alongside Lake Quinault, the old Post Office building now houses a diverse collection of artifacts related to the local area. Exhibits cover the varied aspects of life in the rain forest, from the native Quinault culture to the pioneer days to the present.
